



METALS PLASTICS

Put in:

- plastic bags
- milk and beverage cartons
- bottle tops and lids
- yogurt containers
- plastic beverage bottles, cleaning products, cosmetics packaging
- metal packaging
- beverage cans

DO NOT put in:

- aerosol packaging
- fat-contaminated packaging
- diapers, wipes, disposable towels
- clothing and textile packaging



PAPER

Put in:

- paper and cardboard packaging
- waste paper, leaflets
- cardboard boxes
- notebooks
- office paper
- newspapers

DO NOT put in:

- diapers
- disposable wipes and towels
- milk and beverage cartons
- oily pizza packaging
- dirty or wet waste paper



GLASS

Put in:

- empty food and beverage bottles and jars, without tops and lids and carrier bags
- empty glass cosmetics bottles

DO NOT put in:

- plastic bags in which glass waste was collected
- window panes
- porcelain, ceramics, crystals, chandeliers
- bulbs, lamps, headlights, insulators
- tableware
- mirrors, car windows



BIO-WASTE

Put in:

- kitchen vegetable waste: peels from vegetables and fruits
- remains of plant products (e.g. coffee and tea grounds)
- grass, leaves, small branches

DO NOT put in:

- kitchen animal remains
- egg shells
- mixed waste
- animal bones and excrements
- wood, ash, gravel, stones



MIXED WASTE

Put in:

- animal bones and excrements: meat, bones, skins leftovers
- egg shells
- disposable diapers
- contaminated paper
- ceramics and textiles
- animal excrements
- ash (cold)
- regular filament bulbs

DO NOT put in:

- batteries
- bulbs and fluorescent lamps
- fluorescent and mercury neon lamps
- paints and varnish residues
- waste electrical and electronic equipment
